KEVIN STREELMAN (-14)

Q. Kevin, first a 66 and now a 64, kind of broken up over two days, but two birdies, two eagles, five birdies and just the one bogey, how do you feel about that?

KEVIN STREELMAN: Yeah, it was a pretty awesome round. I drove it nicely. I actually didn't get off to too great of a start, had a few pars after that, but made the nice eagle at 8 to finish kind of the night and then came out this morning and just caught fire, birdied 11 and 13, eagle there at 15 and made a few nice birdies on top of that, so it's really fun. It's kind of a shootout feel, not a ton of wind and when we get to go lift, clean and place, we're going to be able to attack the greens.

Q. I think I asked you yesterday how a 66 sat with you and you felt good about it, and back it up with a 64. Just in general, are you feeling really good about the position of your game right now?

KEVIN STREELMAN: I do, but clearly you're going to have to continue to attack, there's going to be no protecting leads out here. So kind of almost brings back to mini-tour days when you go as low as you can as quickly as you can and I enjoy that. Putter feels nice. The champion is going to have to putt very well the next two rounds because a lot of us are going to have a lot of looks for birdies. Should be exciting to watch, good for the fans.

Q. I know there's a lot of stopping and starting, it's the game of golf, it's going to happen. Are you pretty good at stopping where you are and keeping your mindset so when you pick back up you're able to continue?

KEVIN STREELMAN: Yeah, you really have to. We're fortunate the fitness trailer's here, although running there, may watch a little Wimbledon and recharge a little bit, but looking like a 2:20, 2:30 start for me this afternoon and hopefully we can get it all in tonight and do nice twosomes tomorrow would be a little extra special.
